Recipe: French pancakes or Crepes.

Sift : ¾ cup flour **A great idea for dessert on 28 February(Shrove Tuesday)**
with ½ tsp salt
1 tsp baking powder
2 tblsp powdered sugar
Beat 2 eggs
Add and beat 2/3 cup milk
1/3 cup water
½ tsp vanilla

Method: make a well in sifted ingredients. Pour in the liquid ingredients (ignore the lumps) rest the batter for about an hour in the fridge. Fry in pan in rather hot oil on both sides. Roll the crepe and sprinkle with confectioner’s sugar. **Enjoy!**
